A surprise shower was held for Pat last Wednesday evening, October 27, at Florence Bartusek's home with all of Pat's sorority sisters attending.

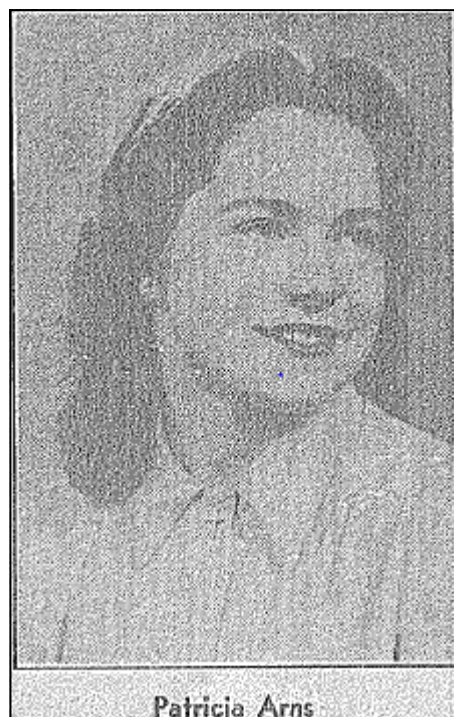
Pat Arns, during her attendance at IIT, was very active in school affairs, climaxing her activities by becoming managing editor on the Technology News.

Kappa Actives: Serving the Community

As a Chapter, Kappa has changed our primary philanthropy to Benton House during the Spring 2012 semester. Previously we had supported Susan G. Komen for the Cure and continue to promote this organization through annual volunteering at the Race for the Cure that took place this year on September 22. Our switch was attributed to the Chapter's desire to make an impact on the local level, primarily the neighborhood we live in.

The Benton House serves to "promote the stability, economic vitality and cultural growth of the community we serve" and has been helping out underprivileged members of the Bridgeport community since 1907. This fall recruitment week, VP of Recruit-

ment Marisa Haire hosted a philanthropy event in support for the Benton House by helping them prepare for a benefit they were having titled, "Benton House Summerfest" with proceeds going to help re-roof one of the Benton House community buildings. Although we

could not coordinate going to the Benton House for the recruitment event itself, we did create the decorations and advertisements for the benefit. Kappa Fundraising Chair Serena Sacco also organized a garage sale during the second weekend of school titled "Kappa Klearance" where not only did the Chapter manage to get rid of the usual unwanted items following the Work Week cleaning of the house, but the ~\$300 profit made on the rainy Sunday morning was donated to the Benton House. Serena is also currently coordinating our annual Tuck-Ins and Nightmares Halloween Fundraiser where proceeds will also be donated to the Benton House. Finally, Sigma Chi Chair Kirsten Landmark-Masih is in the process of organizing a Kappa service event with the group for the end of this fall semester.

Was married in Arvada, Colorado on September 22. She and her husband, Matt, live in Colorado Springs.

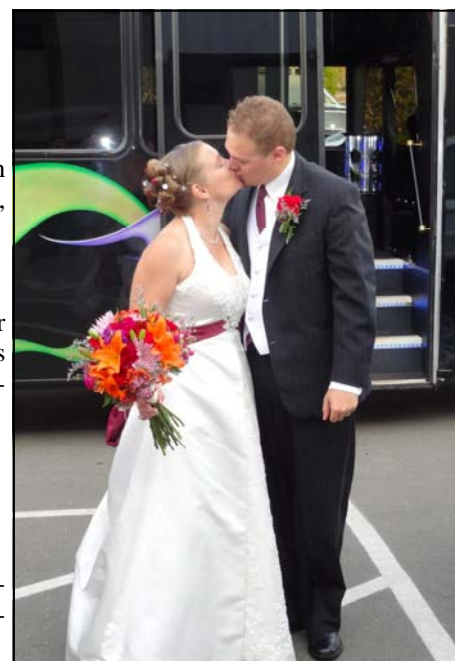
