Roller Derby in a Small Town

In November of 2009, five women met around a bon fire with the ambitious goal of bringing Roller Derby to Central Louisiana. What have we gotten ourselves into?

Since that first fateful meeting we have formed a league, recruited 30 women to start skating with us (along with an enthusiastic handful of men to cheer us on) and have been working our way through the logistics of training, coaching and wrangling all the personalities that come with a derby team.



Derby girls come in all shapes, sizes, and ages. Fishnets, tattoos and piercings are not required—some of us have them, some of us don't. Some of the girls on the roster are lifelong athletes; others had never tried a sport outside of gym class.

The Cenla Derby Dames have been training since November and are well on our way to being ready for our first bouts this fall. In a small town like Alexandria, we get lots of “what are those girls doing?” and “are you serious?” We are.

My primary role within the league is Treasurer (call me by my derby name: Accounts Bleedable). I quickly discovered, with the help of a broken tailbone, that I'm not born to skate but I do help keep these rowdy girls in line. Working with our coach (Puppet Master) and Team Captains (Jack RaBBit \$lim and Rukkus Ryder) we are whipping these girls into shape.

We are currently fund-raising for equipment, seeking out venues for upcoming bouts, and attending as many promotional events as possible to get the community excited about our league. April 10th will be the first display of our skill as a team when we roll into Renegade Harley-Davidson's annual Crawfish Boil for a demonstrational scrimmage. The buzz around town is growing. People are excited for something new. Fans are gearing up for our first bout. The girls are skating hard and hitting harder!

Roller Derby in a College Town

On my way home from Kappa's Alumni Reunion last fall, Sarah called and told me all about a roller derby league that she was starting. Her excitement was contagious and when I got home I immediately went on a quest for a league in my area. It turns out that there wasn't one, but I did find a group of like-minded women who



wanted to start a league here in Champaign-Urbana. Within a few months, we've formed the Twin City Derby Girls, recruited 40 skaters, a fantastic coaching team, referees, and fans. In addition to practicing twice a week and attending promotional events, we also do a lot of volunteer work in the community. So far we've sponsored a week long fashion and music extravaganza to support the arts and volunteered for our public television telethon.

In addition to skating as a pivot or blocker, I also serve as the league president. (It turns out that all of those years of leadership in Kappa have come in very handy!) I now skate 4-5 times a week and spend countless hours working with our volunteers, coaches and skaters to help build and promote the league. Needless to say, my life has gotten dramatically busier in the last few months, but it is definitely worth it!

Our league is currently working towards our first public scrimmage and is hoping to be accepted as a WFTDA apprentice league by mid-summer.

What is Roller Derby?

Roller Derby is one of the fastest growing sports in America, with nearly 400 leagues world-wide. In its current incarnation, roller derby is a genuine athletic competition complete with well-defined rules, divisions, tournaments and a governing body – the Women's Flat Track Derby Association (WFTDA). So what are the rules? Basically, there are two teams of five women. Each team consists of one jammer, three blockers and one pivot. The blockers form a skating pack. The blockers/pivots start skating at the first whistle, and then the jammers (who start behind the pack) start sprinting at the second whistle. The jammers then have to skate through the pack. The first one through the pack is called the Lead Jammer. Both jammers continue to sprint around the rink a second time in order to lap the pack. Jammers score one point for every opponent they lap. The pivot and blockers try to help their team's jammer break through the pack while simultaneously blocking the opposing jammer. The Jam goes on for 2 minutes or until the Lead Jammer calls it off.
